#### Target 4:

#### **School in Community**

The school facilities are used by the Bowling Club, the local G.A.A. club, the local soccer club, The Credit Union and the local Allotment organisation. Choir contributed to Funerals, Masses and Confirmation in the parish. The school facilities have been used over the summer for Campa Cormac and to host Irish revision classes for all local students during the Easter break. The pupils raised substantial funds for Concern, Habitat for Humanity, Trocaire, Cancer Research, SVP and local cancer charities. We have a very successful Link-Up programme operational with local primary and special schools which year 13 students participate in. The RE Department works very closely with the Parish Council to promote our pupils' faith development and plays an active role in Catholic Schools' Week each January. We have embarked on a number of cross-phase literacy and numeracy projects with our local primary schools, both English and Irish medium schools. The school continues to place a high value on primary school visits in the run-up to Open Night and Open night itself when we invite parents and pupils who are interested in our post-primary offer.

#### **Careers**

Work experience for all of Year 13 took place in June and for Year 12 in January. There were visits from personnel from Queen's University Belfast, University of Ulster, St. Mary's Training College, Scottish Universities and Letterkenny Institute. There were also visits from a Banking Officer dealing with budgeting, a talk on Stress Management and a visit from a Student Welfare Officer from QUB. Students participated in a number of other events organised by the Careers Department, including mock interviews for medicine and dentistry as well as for nursing and teaching

Year 14 students had the opportunity to visit local university open days at the start of the school year to assist in their decision making for UCAS applications.

#### Cairde Brogán

Cairde Brogán, launched in November 2017, continues to grow from strength to strength. The aim of the Foundation is to build connections with inspirational leaders in the business, voluntary, creative and professional communities so that our pupils have opportunities beyond the classroom to enhance their employability skills. The Foundation is also committed to providing financial support for young people so that they can enjoy experiences that offer them the best prospects for employment in the future.

#### **Extra Curricular Activity**

The main extra-curricular activities occur on a daily basis within school on both a weekly and termly basis. Most of these activities are captured on the table "Lunch time and Living Activities, 2018-2019" which is found on the school website. In addition, other organised workshops and visits are noted on the "Year Plan 2018-2019" document and include awareness raising on important issues such as Internet Safety Week, Catholic Schools Week, study skills, Internet Safety Week, Anti-bullying Week, the Gaisce Award, JP2 Award and many other including school trips at home and abroad. There is a strong focus on sport within the school with Gaelic and soccer as well as handball, camogie and hurling all a feature of the school sporting calendar. Team sports continue to excel in the school with many notable successes posted on social media for the attention of parents and the wider community.

#### **Catholic Ethos in the Curriculum**

Fr. Murphy continues to lend his support to the school in his capacity as school chaplain and celebrates Masses during the year as well as the planned liturgies such as the Year 8 Blessing, the St Brigid's cross blessing and the penitential service. Faith development remains a key feature of the School Development Plan.

#### **Recording and Reporting**

All parents/guardians received one full, statutory report in addition to several tracking reports. Parents are also invited to discuss any concerns with teachers by arranging an appointment with relevant school staff.

#### Parent/School

Induction meetings for students in Year 8, 11 and 13 were held at start of term.

Year 10 and 12 Parents and Pupils had an "Options Evening" in advance of the pupils choosing KS4 and post-16 subjects.

Parent/Teacher meetings were held for all pupils and were well attended.

Parents continue to facilitate extra-curricular work by collecting and delivering pupils and support the school generously.

#### Aims of School Policy regarding Special Educational Needs:

- Identity and address the special education needs of all pupils.
- ♦ All pupils who experience learning difficulties will receive appropriate educational provision to enable them to overcome their difficulties as far as possible.
- ♦ Involvement of parents is essential. Parents will be involved in any decision taken about the education of their child.
- ♦ In determining educational provision to be made, the ascertainable wishes of the child will be considered in light of her age / understanding.
- ♦ Pupils with special educational needs, including those with statements, wherever appropriate will be educated alongside their peers.
- ♦ Promotion of close co-operation between all agencies concerned and a multi-disciplinary approach to the resolution of issues.
- ♦ Annual review of the special educational provision arranged for individual students and an update and monitoring of educational targets. Teachers monitor and informally review a student's progress during the course of the year and if a child's special needs change, a review will be scheduled and appropriate actions implemented to ensure that the suitable provision is made.
- ♦ All staff are made aware of the importance of identifying and providing for pupils with special education needs and are informed of those pupils who have statements.

#### **Admission Arrangements for Special Educational Needs**

The admission arrangements with respect to the majority of pupils with special educational needs are consistent with the school's general arrangements for all other pupils. Children with statements of special educational needs are placed in schools at the request of the EA - Southern Region. When seeking to place a pupil with a statement, the EA will take into account the ability of the school to meet the child's special educational needs, the provision of efficient education for other children in the class or school and the efficient use of resources.

#### **Disability Access**

The main school entrances have ramps fitted to facilitate wheelchair access and a chair lift has been installed to allow pupil access to the first floor of the main building. Risk assessments are conducted for pupil who are temporarily indisposed and suitable arrangements made for them to access the curriculum as normal.

#### **Security**

The school's fire safety equipment and fittings have been upgraded to current statutory requirements and access control arrangements are in place. There is a pending minor works application to further enhance access control. Currently, all visitors must sign in to reception and are issued with a pass when they are to remain on the school site. There are CCTV cameras which monitor the external school site.

#### **Extra-Curricular Offer**

A comprehensive programme of preparation for adult working life is organised for Sixth Formers on a modular basis including an active Community Link programme. Sport is an important feature of school life and there are many teams for Gaelic Football and Hurling, Camogie, Basketball, Cross Country, Athletics, Netball and many other sports.

There are various school choirs and a school orchestra. Drama, public speaking and debating are integral parts of English teaching in the school. Besides the curricular musical programme of study, a range of other music can be pursued.

There is a comprehensive range of lunchtime activities provided throughout the year to accommodate the preferences of most children. Leadership opportunities are an important feature of school life and pupils have the possibility of applying for prefect and mentoring roles and for the Muiredach and John Paul II Awards. Pupils may volunteer through school for charity work, may volunteer on the Link-Up programme and can apply to work as an aid on the annual Lourdes pilgrimage. There was also the opportunity to apply for a place on the Habitat for Humanity team of staff and students who spent two weeks in Cambodia.
